 - in particular racism and heteronormativity

'Indians of the second generation' in 'Germany'

- definition:
- socialised in 'Germany'
- and marked as 'Indians'
- in terminology of Paul Mecheril:
- 'Other Germans'
- belonging to several natio-ethno-cultural contexts at the same time

Outside the boundaries

- 'German' defined exclusively
 - unambigous
 - through 'blood' and 'culture'
- 'Indians of the second generation' othered and excluded
 - formally and informally
 - mainly implicitly
 - everyday experience
- privileged legally, socially, economically
 - not endangering their existence

The Indernet

- internet portal: http://www.theinder.net
- founded in summer of 2000
 - internet boom and 'Kinder statt Inder'
- by three 'Indians of second generation'
- as plattform for 'Indians of the second generation'
 - for communication and information
- and information portal for 'Germans'

An own space

- an own representation of 'India' and 'Indianness'
- implicit norm of multiple belongingness
- absence of natio-ethno-cultural othering
- for those close enough to fictitious prototype of 'Indian of the second generation'
- pan-'Indian' identity imagined
- in German
- natio-ethno-cultural boundaries shifted out of sight
 - for those not deviating too much from prototype

Boundaries maintained

- essentialising 'origin'
- othering for those
 - seen as deviating significantly from prototype
- other lines of difference:
 - class
 - heteronormativity
 - gender roles
 - homophobia
