The Indernet

- internet portal www.theinder.net
 - made by ,Indians of the second generation
 - for ,Indians of the second generation
- symbollically refers to ,India
 - -name, logo, project description, topics
- is localised in ,Germany'
 - -language, topics, users



A space for multiple belongingness

- Indians of the second generation
 - faced with norm of univocal natio-ethno-cultural belongingess
 - experiencing multiple natio-ethno-cultural belongingness
 - resulting in experiences of othering and discrimination
- the Indernet
 - an own space of the ,second generation'
 - multiple belongingness as implicit norm
 - a refuge



Imagining ,Indianness'

- belongingness to ,Germany' refused
 - belongingness to ,India' ascribed
- belongingness to ,India' imagined
 - in reaction to experiences in ,Germany'
 - while in ,Germany'
 - to an imagined ,India
- imagined ,Indianness' more linked to ,Germany' than to ,India'
